This year we will offer a variety of activities especially tailored to meet the WORLD SCOUT ENVIRONMENT AWARD (WSEA) for CUBS!

Activities on Saturday offer Recycling Meets STEM, Climate Change, and Leave No Trace. For those returning to Environment Camp, there will be different Activity Centres, including Natural Disasters, Building an Emergency Shelter, Planning for an Emergency, Using Natural Habitat for Food & Water.

Your youth are invited to participate in the campfire on Saturday night. We are reminding you that Blue Springs Scout Reserve offers marked trails and an outdoor obstacle course and eco-friendly practices.

Youth can earn credit toward Personal Achievement Badges for Earth, Air, Water and Science through participation in these activities and also meet requirements for Environment & Outdoors, Active & Healthy Living, Citizenship and Creative Expression, Belief & Values programs and use of S.T.E.M approaches supplied by The Canadian Path.

Although Pack units may vary in what they offer to youth while at Blue Springs, youth can also earn credit toward Levels 1-4 of Camping Skills, Trail Skills, Emergency Aid and Scoutcraft in Outdoor Skills. Each Cub Scout gets a personalized list of skills achieved toward the *World Scout Environment Award* – Cubs to take home.
